

RESERVED SEATS

Important Notes for Applicants:

- Applicants who have participated in Inter-school, District, Provincial or National Sports, Qirat, Naat, Debates, Drama and Singing competitions or can play a musical instrument are eligible for admission on the basis of extra-curricular activities. The applicant must provide copies of certificates indicating the same.
- Foreign applicants will come through the Federal Ministry of Education, Government of Pakistan or Higher Education Commission Islamabad.
- Overseas Pakistani applicants will submit their foreign qualification certificate as evidence along with their NICOP or any of the parents.
- For the daughter of the martyr, death certificate attested by the concerned department must be attached.
- Applicants of religious minorities must provide supporting documents.
- Disabled applicants must submit their disability certificates from Social Welfare and Bait-ul-Maal Department, medical reports and any other relevant documents.
- Applicants from Baluchistan, Sindh, KPK, Gilgit Baltistan and Azad Jammu and Kashmir must submit their nominations through the concerned Provincial Government along with the domicile certificate.
- The students applying on the bases of O' Level/equivalent qualification are eligible for provisional admission. The admission will be confirmed upon submission of their complete result (I.e. 8 subjects as per IBCC rules). The university will register them with BISE Lahore only if they fulfill this requirement before the board registration requirement.
- After the closing of registration date if the IBCC original documents are not submitted to the college, the institute will not be responsible for the registration.
- If the candidate has not submitted their original migration certificate before the due
 date of registration the candidate will be responsible for her admission, the college
 will not be responsible for the registration.

Three (03) sets of attested photocopies of the following documents must be attached with the application form, filled online from University's website and downloaded from email received from UHE.

- To secure admission, all dues must be deposited within the prescribed date.
- The admission will be cancelled, if dues are not deposited by the due date. Vacant seats will be filled by the candidates on the waiting list.
- However, special permission by the Admission Committee may be granted in case of the availability of vacant seats.

Attending an orientation session is mandatory for students. Names of students, who remain absent from classes without intimation to the Principal's Office for a period of 15 Days, will be struck off.

Identity cards will be issued to the students to carry while at campus and produce on demand. Otherwise, they will have to pay Rs.100 as a fine. In case of a card being lost a duplicate card will be issued for Rs. 400 Parent/Teacher meeting will be held in the first week of February.

No student will be allowed to sit in a higher examination without clearing the lower year examination.

As the Intermediate courses are of specialized nature, the students are required, students are required to maintain a minimum of 75% attendance to be eligible for the Final Examination.

The students who take a break during Intermediate Program for a valid reason may resume studies within a period of three years. They shall be readmitted only if the same scheme of studies is in practice. This concession is valid only once in the whole Intermediate Program. Such students shall take the examination in the same Syllabus enforced at that time.

CONDUCT AND DISCIPLINE



The students of Intermediate (Part 1 and Part 2) shall strictly follow uniform rules. The uniform follows as:

- White cotton shalwar and shirt with sleeves and collar Turquois dupatta Scarves, if worn, should be plain black, white, gray or light pink.
- Turquoise blazer decked with University crest is an essential part of winter uniform.
- Plain black sweaters without any stripes or pattern White socks, Black shoes or black joggers.
- Wearing overalls is mandatory for every student during practical classes.
- We highly appreciate parent's co-operation with the University Authorities in maintaining simplicity, neatness and modesty regarding their girl's dress.
